

Sec. 1. Recommendations required. Resolved: That the Animal Welfare Advisory Committee, as established by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 2-C, shall submit a report, including any necessary implementing legislation, to provide for the state licensure of dog groomers. The report must be submitted to the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature by January 1, 1998. The Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources shall provide the necessary staff to the committee in the preparation of its report. Members of the committee are not entitled to compensation other than that authorized under Title 7, section 3906-C.

SUMMARY

This resolve directs the Animal Welfare Advisory Committee to make recommendations to the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature to provide for the state licensure of dog groomers.
