- Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study Insurance Fraud, referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is established; and be it further
- Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 8 members:

- representatives from the insurance industry, appointed by the Superintendent of Insurance. Insurance trade groups may make recommendations to the superintendent regarding appointees to the commission; and
- Three members of the Joint Standing Committee on Banking and Insurance. Of the members selected, one must be a Senator, appointed by the President of the Senate; one must be a Representative, appointed by the Speaker of the House and one must be a member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives; and be it further
- 3. Appointments; meetings. Resolved: 20 appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the 22 Legislative Council must be notified by all authorities once the selections have been made. Within 15 days 24 the appointment of all members, the Chair Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of 26 the commission. The commission shall select a chair from among its members; and be it further 28
- Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study 30 insurance fraud and make recommendations based on its findings. In conducting the study, the commission shall examine laws 32 concerning insurance fraud from other states, including, but not Massachusetts and Florida to determine 34 limited to, effectiveness of those laws. The commission may also address other issues relevant to the study; and be it further 36
  - Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Bureau of Insurance shall provide staffing assistance; and be it further
    - Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the commission are entitled to reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses, upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council; and be it further
- Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the joint standing committee having jurisdiction over banking 48 and insurance matters and to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council no later than December 1, 1998. 50 commission requires an extension, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension. 52
