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SENATE AMENDMENT

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 288, L.D. 939

This amendment may reduce the cost to the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services by permitting, not requiring identification badges for certain employees. If the department elects to require these badges, the additional costs can be absorbed by the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services utilizing existing budgeted resources.

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SUMMARY

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The original bill requires certain employees of health care facilities to wear identification badges that display the employees' licensure status. This amendment instead provides that if a health care facility permits or requires its employees to wear identification badges, that health care facility may not prohibit the display on those badges of the employees' licensure status.
