	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1717 is enacted to read:

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	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the
8	context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the
	following meanings.
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12	A. "Health care facility" means a facility that provides health care services directly to patients, including, but not limited to, a hospital, clinic, pharmacy, health care
14	provider's office, health maintenance organization, diagnostic or treatment center, neuropsychiatric or mental
16	health facility, hospice or nursing home.
18	B. "Identification badge" means a badge, designed to be worn on a person's clothing, that is visible, readable and
20	displays the name, licensure status and staff position of
	the person wearing the badge.
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	2. Identification badge required. A person shall wear an
24	identification badge if that person:
26	A. Observes, examines, treats or otherwise provides health care services directly to patients or residents at a health
28	care facility; and
30	B. Is employed by, works for, volunteers with, contracts with, leases space from or otherwise provides services at a
32	health care facility.
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	SUMMARY
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	This bill requires that persons who observe, examine or
38	treat patients or residents at health care facilities wear identification badges.
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
