An Act to Put to Referendum the Option of Authorizing a Tribe-owned Casino.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §348 is enacted to read:

§348. Tribe-owned casino

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Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Governor8shall conduct good faith negotiations with the Passamaquoddy
Tribe on behalf of the State to enter into a tribal-state compact10governing the conduct of electronic and table games of chance on
any Passamaquoddy Indian Reservation land. Upon taking effect a12tribal-state compact with the Passamaquoddy Tribe has the force
and effect of law and is the license of the tribe as that term is14used in Title 17-A, section 951.

Sec. 2. Statutory referendum procedure; submission at statewide election; form of question; effective date. This Act must be submitted to the legal voters of the State of Maine at a statewide election held on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following passage of this Act. The municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, to vote on the acceptance or rejection of this Act by voting on the following question:

"Do you favor requiring the Governor to negotiate a compact with the Passamaquoddy Tribe to authorize operation of a casino on the Passamaquoddy Indian Reservation?"

30 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice 32 by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, 34 sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. 36 The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of 38 the legal votes are cast in favor of the Act, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay, and the Act takes effect upon 40 the date of the proclamation.

42 The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this
44 Act necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.

SUMMARY

Subject to public referendum, this bill requires the 6 Governor to negotiate a compact with the Passamaquoddy Tribe regarding the operation of electronic and table games of chance 8 on Passamaquoddy Indian Reservation lands.

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
