An Act to Modify the Prohibition against Bathing in Sebago Lake within 2 Miles of the Intakes of the Portland Water District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1913, c. 157, §2, first sentence, as amended by P&SL 1991, c. 12, §5, is further amended to read:

A person may not bathe in the waters of Sebago Lake within 2 miles of the intakes of the Portland Water District, except those persons who reside along the western shore of Sebago Lake and whose properties abut the lake at a point within 2 miles of the intakes or who have deeded access to the properties that abut the lake at a point within 2 miles of the intakes and are served by
roads commonly known as Eel Cove Road and Smith Mill Road, nor may any person wash linen or other articles of personal apparel in the waters of the lake.

SUMMARY

Current law provides that a person may not bathe in Sebago Lake within 2 miles of the intakes of the Portland Water District. This bill provides an exception to this law for persons whose properties abut the lake at a point within 2 miles of the intakes or who have deeded access to such an area and who are served by either Eel Cove Road or Smith Mill Road.
