	Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §5219-L is enacted to read:

or	sewer services provider is allowed a credit against the tax
lue	under this chapter equal to the sum paid by the customer for
wate	er or sewer services or both attributable to increased costs
to	the supplier of services as a result of unfunded mandates

wate	er or sewer services shall annually identify to each customer
the	amount of the customer's bill that represents an unfunded
