estimated to be \$83.78 per day per prisoner. These savings do
not affect reimbursement by the State. The reduction in the number of prosecutions that would have resulted in a jail
sentence and the resulting savings to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

The Judicial Department may realize some minor savings from 8 reductions of workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of cases that will no longer be filed in the 10 court system. Reductions in the collection of fines may decrease General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

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## SUMMARY

16 This amendment removes the sections of the bill that repeal the license requirement for timeshare agents. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
