Sec. 1. Lewiston as part of the southern or south-central region of the State. Resolved: That, when recommending or implementing policy guidelines on marketing, promotion and advertising strategies for tourism growth pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, sections 13090-C, 13090-E and 13090-F, the Office of Tourism and Community Development and the Maine Tourism Commission shall include the City of Lewiston as part of the southern region or the south-central region of the State.
