36	This bill allows professional or registered nurses and advanced practice registered nurses employed by licensed home
38	health care or hospice agencies to, in the course of employment, possess and administer certain preapproved noncontrolled
40	prescription drugs according to written protocols developed by their employers through their medical advisory committees.
