Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 34-B MRSA §1207, sub-§1, ¶C-1 is enacted to read:

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C-1. In an executive session as provided in Title 1, section 405, subsection 6, paragraph F, the commissioner shall disclose to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters information concerning the death from unnatural causes of a patient admitted to a state mental health institute. The disclosure must occur within 5 days of the death. A person receiving the disclosure information under this paragraph may not discuss or disclose that information other than in executive session:

SUMMARY

This bill requires the Commissioner of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services to disclose information concerning the death from unnatural causes of a patient admitted to a state mental health institute to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services. The disclosure may occur only when the committee is in executive session and must occur within 5 days of the death. No one receiving the information may discuss or disclose it outside of executive session.
