An Act to Allow a Left Turn on a Red Light on One-way Streets.

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 4	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2057, sub-§1, $\PC$ , as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5 is amended to read:
6	C. A red light:
8	(1) If steady and circular, means the operator must stop and remain standing until an indication to proceed
10	is shown.
12	An operator may cautiously enter the intersection to make a right turn after stopping, unless prohibited by
14	an appropriate sign such as "NO RIGHT TURN ON RED."
16	An operator executing a turn shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians on a crosswalk and to a
18	vehicle having a green signal at the intersection;
20	An operator may cautiously enter the intersection to make a left turn after stopping only when expressly
22	allowed by an appropriate sign such as "ONE-WAY STREET: LEFT TURN ALLOWED ON RED AFTER STOPPING" in cases where
24	both roadways are one-way streets.
26	(2) If a steady arrow, means the operator may not enter the intersection to make the movement indicated
28	by that arrow; or
30	(3) If showing rapid intermittent flashes, means the operator must stop and then proceed as if at a stop
32	sign.
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36	SUMMARY
38	This bill allows a driver to make a left turn after stopping at a red light if both roads at an intersection are one-way
40	streets.

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
