The rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

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## SUMMARY

14 This resolve directs the Department of Human Services to convene a task force to study current departmental rules concerning minimum staffing levels required of nursing facilities 16 with the purpose of recommending to the department how those 18 rules might be amended to better meet the needs of residents of nursing facilities. The task force will20 representatives of the Department of Human Services, residents of nursing facilities or families of residents, agencies who serve 22 residents and their families and providers of nursing facility services.
