	The requirement that all licensed professionals who provide
36	substance abuse counseling must first pass examinations given by the State Board of Alcohol and Drug Counselors within the
38	Department of Professional and Financial Regulation will increase the board's dedicated revenues and expenditures. The amounts
40	will depend on the number of licensed professionals who decide to offer substance abuse counseling under the new requirements,
42	which can not be determined at this time.
44	The providers of agencies funded by the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services will
46	incur additional costs in order to allow existing staff to

continue to provide substance abuse counseling services. These additional costs, including the cost of preparing individuals for the examinations, may increase the cost per unit of service purchased by the department, resulting in the need for additional General Fund appropriations or service reductions.

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The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

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SUMMARY

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This amendment clarifies that the State Board of Alcohol and Drug Counselors may waive examination for applicants if the international certification reciprocity consortium for alcohol and other drugs recognizes that the person has met requirements equivalent to state licensing requirements for substance abuse counselors.

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
