32 SUMMARY

Current law allows licensed health care professionals to provide substance abuse counseling as long as that is not the only professional service the person provides.

This bill requires the licensed professional to successfully complete examinations given by the State Board of Alcohol and Drug Counselors. This bill also allows the State Board of Alcohol and Drug Counselors to waive examination for applicants if the National Certification Reciprocity Consortium or a similar organization recognizes the person as having met state licensing requirements for substance abuse counselors.
