An Act to Ensure Consistency Between State and Federal Special Education Requirements.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §7004 is enacted to read:

§7004. Special education

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 Rulemaking. The department shall identify in its regulatory agenda, when feasible, a proposed rule or provision of a proposed rule that is anticipated to be more stringent than the federal statute or regulation, if an applicable federal statute or regulation exists.

During the consideration of any proposed rule by the board, when feasible, and using information available to it, the department shall identify provisions of the proposed rule that the department believes would impose a regulatory burden more stringent than the burden imposed by the corresponding federal statute or regulation, if such a federal statute or regulation exists, and explain in a separate section of the basis statement the justification for the difference between the agency rule and the federal statute or regulation.

Sec. 2. Current rules; review. Any rule of the Department of Education concerning special education in existence on the 24 effective date of this Act is subject to the review requirements of this Act for proposed rules. 26 The department shall evaluate the current rules concerning special education, identify provisions believed to impose a regulatory burden more stringent 28 than the burden imposed by the corresponding federal statute or 30 regulation, if such a statute or regulation exists, and explain the justification for the difference. The department shall 3.2 report the results of this evaluation to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs no later than March 34 1, 1998.

SUMMARY

The purpose of this bill is to ensure that state and federal 40 special education requirements are consistent and that any rule currently in place or to be adopted not exceed federal regulations concerning special 42 education requirements. It requires the Department of Education to identify provisions of a 44 proposed rule anticipated to be more stringent than the corresponding federal statute or regulation and explain the justification for the difference. It further subjects any rule 46 concerning special education currently in existence to the same 48 review requirements.
