'FISCAL NOTE

8 If the Legislative Council employs independent legal counsel to assist an investigating committee, the Legislature will require additional General Fund appropriations to pay for those legal services.'

SUMMARY

16 replaces The amendment the bill. It authorizes the Legislative Council to employ legal counsel for a legislative investigating committee if the council believes that representing 18 the committee would place the Department of the Attorney General 20 in a conflict with its representation of persons or entities subject to investigation and existing legislative staff does not 22 provide the needed services. Under these circumstances, the Legislative Council would not be subject to the requirement to 24 obtain approval of the Attorney General to hire independent legal . counsel.
