- Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7202, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 420, §1, is amended to read:
- 1. Issuance. The commissioner may grant permits to Except as provided in section 9906, a person may not introduce, import or transport any live freshwater fish or eggs into the State or to receive or have in possession fish or eggs so introduced, imported or transported without a permit issued by the commissioner.
- Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §7203, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 420, \$1, is amended to read:
- 16
 1. Issuance. The commissioner may issue a written permit allewing Except as provided in section 9906, a person to may not introduce fish of any kind into any inland waters by means of live fish or otherwise without a permit issued by the commissioner.
- Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §9902, first ¶, as amended by PL 1995, c. 535, §2, is further amended to read:

The authority has the sole authority and responsibility to manage the Atlantic salmon fishery in the State, including the sole authority to introduce Atlantic salmon into Maine inland or coastal waters, to import, stock, rear or permit the importation, stocking or rearing of Atlantic salmon, live or as eggs, into Maine or into Maine inland or coastal waters, other than commercial aquaculture facilities and associated activities. This sole authority does not take effect for the inland waters of the Sheepscot, Narraguagus, Pleasant, Machias, East Machias and Dennys rivers until July 1, 1997. The authority has the sole authority to limit or prohibit the taking of Atlantic salmon, issue licenses for the taking of Atlantic salmon and adopt rules establishing the time, place and manner of Atlantic salmon fishing in all waters of the State. In addition to these powers and duties, the authority may:

Sec. 4. 12 MRSA §9902, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

7. Liaison with federal authorities and regional commissions. Serve as the State's designated liaison to the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, to other federal authorities and to the fisheries conservation authorities of any other state on all matters relating to the management, restoration, enhancement, importation, rearing or stocking of Atlantic salmon, other than commercial aquaculture facilities and associated activities. The authority is also the lead state

agency regarding such matters for purposes of formulating policies, standards or procedures in cooperation with the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Management Commission or other federal or regional authorities.

Sec. 5. 12 MRSA §9902-A is enacted to read:

§9902-A. Consultation with other departments

The authority shall consult from time to time with the Commissioner of Marine Resources and the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to ensure that each is fully apprised on all activities that may affect the interests of the others. If the authority determines that an activity under its consideration may have a potential adverse impact on existing populations of other salmonoids or anadromous fish, the authority shall consult with those commissioners on that issue but retains its sole authority under this chapter to decide upon all matters relating to Atlantic salmon.

Sec. 6. 12 MRSA §9906, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 406, §12, is amended to read:

§9906. Importation, rearing and stocking of Atlantic salmon

The authority may grant an exemption from the provisions of section 6071, subsection 4, for Atlantic salmon, live or eggs, imported for the purpose of enhancing the State's Atlantic salmon fisheries, whether by rearing, stocking in any inland or coastal waters, or otherwise.

1. Importation or stocking of salmon fish or eggs by the authority. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 6071, 7202 or 7203, the authority may import or utilize Atlantic salmon, live or as eggs, from any hatchery or commercial aquaculture facility located in or outside the State and may introduce those live fish, eggs or fish hatched from those eggs into any inland or coastal waters of the State if the authority determines that those eggs or live fish meet all salmonoid fish health testing and grading standards established by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service and all salmonoid fish health policies adopted by the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission pursuant to chapter 419, subchapter I.

2. Permit required. A person may not import, transport, possess, rear or stock any Atlantic salmon, live or as eggs, other than commercial aquaculture facilities and associated activities, without a permit from the authority. The permit must require that fish or eggs meet the health testing and grading

requirements of subsection 1 and all other applicable terms or conditions in rules adopted by the authority. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.

SUMMARY

The purpose of this bill is to clarify any ambiguity regarding the division of responsibility for matters relating to Atlantic salmon among the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, the Department of Marine Resources and the Atlantic Salmon Authority. The Atlantic Salmon Authority was created by Public Law 1995, chapter 406 to "manage the Atlantic salmon fishery in the State and conduct and coordinate all projects involving research, planning, management, restoration or propagation of the Atlantic salmon."

This bill clarifies that the Atlantic Salmon Authority has the sole authority to introduce, import, stock and rear or to permit the introduction, importation, stocking and rearing of Atlantic salmon, live or as eggs, into the State or into the inland or coastal waters of the State.

The bill also establishes the Atlantic Salmon Authority as the State's liaison to federal, regional and state authorities on issues pertaining to Atlantic salmon and allows the authority to accept Atlantic salmon, live or as eggs, from hatcheries and commercial aquaculture facilities inside and outside the State if those fish or eggs meet the health and grading standards adopted by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service and the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission.

 The bill also prohibits any person, except commercial aquaculture facilities, from importing, transporting, possessing, rearing or stocking Atlantic salmon without a permit issued by the authority.
