Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA $\S683$, first \P , as amended by PL 1995, c. 3. $\S2$, is further amended to read:

The Maine Land Use Regulation Commission, as established by Title 5, section 12004-D, subsection 1 to carry out the purposes stated in section 681, is created within the Department of Conservation, and in this chapter called the "commission." The commission is charged with implementing this chapter in all of the unorganized and deorganized areas of the State. commission consists of 7 public members, none of whom may be state employees, who must be appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over conservation matters and to confirmation by the Legislature, for staggered 4-year terms. Among the public members, there must be 4 who must be knowledgeable in at least one of each of the following areas: commerce and industry; fisheries and wildlife; forestry; and conservation. potential -- appointees -- to -- the -- commission /- -- the -- Governor -- shall actively-seek-and-give-consideration-to-persons-residing-in-or near-the-unorganized-areas-of-the-State-and-to-persons-residing en-unerganized-coastal-islands. At least 2 4 of the members must be residents within the commission's jurisdiction.

SUMMARY

Current law requires that at least 2 of the 7 members of the Land Use Regulation Commission be residents of territory within the jurisdiction of the commission. This bill requires that 4 of the members be residents of territory within the jurisdiction of the commission.
