2	Sec. 1. 4 MRSA §807-B is enacted to read:
4	§807-B. Representation by paralegals in small claims or
6	alternative dispute resolution
8	On adoption of rules by the Supreme Judicial Court, a paralegal may represent a client in an action cognizable as a
10	small claim under Title 14, chapter 738 or in alternative dispute resolution recognized by the Supreme Judicial Court. The Supreme
12	Judicial Court may adopt rules specifying qualifications for paralegals authorized to represent a client under this section.
14	Qualifications must include graduation from an accredited paralegal training course at an institution of higher education.

20	This bill permits paralegals to represent clients in small claims cases and in alternative dispute resolution according to
