HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 865, L.D. 1182, Bill, "An Act to Amend Coded Licenses"

Amend the amendment by striking out everything after the title and inserting in its place the following:

'Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:

Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §1404, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read:

1. Under 21. A person less than 21 years of age bears a distinctive color code; and

Sec. 2. 29-A MRSA §1404, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1995, c. 645, Pt. B, §14 and affected by §24, is further amended to read:

2. Prior convictions; on or after July 1, 1996. A person convicted on or after July 1, 1996 of operating under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or with an excessive blood-alcohol level, as defined in section 2453, subsection 2, within 10 years of the date the license is issued, reissued or returned after a period of suspension bears a coded notation of that fact; and

Sec. 3. 29-A MRSA §1404, sub-§3 is enacted to read:

3. Prior conviction; before July 1, 1996. A person convicted before July 1, 1996 of operating under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or with an excessive blood-alcohol


6 **Sec. 4. Retroactivity.** This Act applies retroactively to July

12 This amendment removes the fiscal impact added by the
13 committee amendment. The bill, as amended by this amendment,
14 will have no fiscal impact.

16 **SUMMARY**

18 This amendment strikes the committee amendment and replaces
19 it with the original bill, which specifies that the increase from
20 6 to 10 in the number of years that a license must be coded
21 applies only to persons convicted on or after July 1, 1996, which
22 was the effective date of the change in the law.
