2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §8120, sub-§3 is enacted to read:**

6 3. **Validity.** A certificate of firearms proficiency is
8 valid for at least 2 years. A private investigator holding a
10 valid certificate of firearms proficiency may not be required to
12 undergo more than one proficiency examination during a 2-year
14 period.

12 SUMMARY

14 This bill specifies that a private investigator's
16 certificate of firearms proficiency is valid for at least 2 years
and that a private investigator may not be required to undergo
more than one proficiency examination during a 2-year period.
