SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 882, L.D. 1199

Deappropriates funds available due to a projected fiscal year 1997-98 balance forward.

8 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TOTAL

Sec. 4. Effective date. This Act takes effect September 1, 12 1998.'

14 Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read 16 consecutively.

FISCAL NOTE

20 This amendment reduces the costs of the bill and generates net General Fund savings of \$15,764 in fiscal year 1998-99. 22 General Fund appropriations totalling \$555,432 in fiscal year 1998-99 are replaced with a General Fund appropriation of 24 \$279,960 for the food benefit costs and a General Fund deappropriation of \$295,724 from savings available from a 26 projected balance forward from fiscal year 1997-98 in the State Supplement to Federal Supplemental Security Income program. Additional General Fund appropriations may be required beginning 28 in fiscal year 1999-2000 to fund the ongoing costs of the food 30 benefit, estimated to be \$315,000. The amounts required will depend on the amount of permanent savings in the State Supplement 32 to Federal Supplemental Security Income program that is available to offset the additional costs.

SUMMARY

This amendment eliminates the provision concerning supplemental security income for legal immigrants. It provides funding for a food benefit for legal aliens from savings available in the State Supplement to the Federal Supplemental Security Income program.
