SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 890, L.D. 1207, Bill, "An Act Concerning Authorization of Educational Technicians"

Amend the bill in section 4 in that part designated "~~S13023.~~" in subsection 3 in the last line (page 1, line 44 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "." the following: 'Nothing in this section requires a school administrative unit to pay for the cost of the professional or academic study or in-service training of an educational technician.'

FISCAL NOTE

This amendment eliminates the state mandate that school administrative units provide for the costs of professional or academic study or in-service training of educational technicians.

SUMMARY

The amendment clarifies that certain costs related to the authorization of educational technicians are not required to be paid by school administrative units, eliminating the state mandate.
