	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §3947, first ¶, as amended by PL 1993, c. 468,
4	§15, is further amended to read:
6	Each municipality shall appoint one or more animal control officers whose duties are enforcement of sections 3911, 3912,
8	3921, 3924, 3943, 3948, 3950, 3950-A <u>, 3950-B</u> and 3966 to 3970, responding to reports of animals suspected of having rabies in
10	accordance with Title 22, sections 1313 and 1313-A and such other duties to control animals as the municipality may require.
12	Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §3950-B is enacted to read:
14	<u>\$3950-B. Nuisance dogs</u>
16	1. Municipalities to adopt ordinance. Each municipality
18	shall adopt an ordinance to address the issue of nuisance dogs. For purposes of this section, a "nuisance dog" means a dog that
20	repeatedly disturbs people by prolonged, repeated or habitual barking, whining, crying, howling or yelping.
22	2. Notice; fines. Ordinances adopted pursuant to this
24	section must include:
26	A. A process for providing notice to the dog owner in the form of a written complaint; and
28	B. A system of graduated fines for subsequent violations.

32	All fines collected pursuant to this section are retained by the municipality.

38	This bill directs municipalities to adopt ordinances to address the problem presented by barking dogs.

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
