Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 2 MRSA §6, first \P , as repealed and replaced by PL 1981, c. 705, Pt. L, §§1-3, is amended to read:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the Governor is б authorized to adjust the salaries of the following state officials within the salary ranges indicated in this section. 8 The adjustment may be at the time of appointment of the official and subsequently as provided by law. The salary ranges shall 10 must be as provided by law; except that, for the purposes of this section, each salary range shall-be is increased by 2 steps in 12 addition to and in the same manner of increase as the steps in the range otherwise provided by law. No other state salary shall 14may be paid to these officials. Any proposal to establish new positions pursuant to this section must be approved in separate 16 legislation by a 2/3 vote of all members elected to each House of 18 the Legislature.

Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §931, sub-§3 is enacted to read:

 3. New major policy-influencing positions. Any proposal to establish new positions pursuant to sections 932 to 952 must be
approved in separate legislation by a 2/3 vote of all members elected to each House of the Legislature.

Sec. 3. Appointed and major policy-influencing positions; position 28 eliminations. State department and agencies, with the assistance of the Bureau of Human Resources within the Department of 30 Administrative and Financial Services, shall develop a plan to reduce the number of state officials appointed pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title major 32 2, section 6 and policy-influencing positions identified in Title 5, chapter 71 to 34 achieve General Fund savings equivalent to 10% of the total General Fund cost of those positions. The Director of the Bureau of Human Resources shall submit a report to the 118th Legislature 36 no later than November 15, 1997 detailing the positions to be eliminated and including any legislation required to implement 38 the eliminations.

42 Sec. 4. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated 42 from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

SUMMARY

This bill directs state departments and agencies to develop appointive number 22 plan to reduce the of state or а policy-influencing positions in order to achieve General Fund savings and provides a statewide General Fund deappropriation of 24 \$500,000 in fiscal year 1998-99.

The bill also requires that any legislation creating new 28 appointive or major policy-influencing positions be separate legislation and receive a 2/3 vote of the Legislature.
