An Act to Restrict the Use of Social Security Numbers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §1271, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 115, §1, is 4 repealed.

Sec. 2. 10 MRSA §1272, as amended by PL 1995, c. 134, §1, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

§1272. Prohibition

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A business organization, government entity or any other 12 entity operating in this State may not request, collect, sell, use or store on any system, paper or electronic, a person's 14 social security number unless it is necessary for collecting or dispersing social security funds or federal law otherwise requires the Federal Government to collect the person's social 16 security number from the business, organization, governmental 18 entity or any other entity.

20 Nothing in this section may be construed to prevent an employer from collecting an employee's social security number.

Sec. 3. 10 MRSA §1273, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 115, §1, is 24 amended to read:

§1273. Administrative enforcement 26

28 The Superintendent--of--the--Bureau-of--Consumer--Credit Protection Attorney General may take appropriate action to ensure 30 compliance with this chapter, including, without limitation+, to: receive and act on complaints; negotiate an assurance in writing 3.2 that a violator will not engage in the same or similar conduct in the future; conduct hearings in accordance with the Maine 34 Administrative Procedure Act and issue a cease and desist order for violation of this chapter; refer--eases--te--the--Attorney General, -- who -- may and bring a civil action against a person for 36 knowingly violating a written assurance of discontinuance. If a 38 court finds a violation of this chapter it may assess a civil forfeiture of not more than \$1,000.

SUMMARY

This bill expands the prohibition under current law on use security numbers to prohibit all 46 of social businesses, organizations, governmental entities and all other entities operating in the State from requesting a person's social security 48 number for any purpose, with exceptions. Businesses and the 50 other specified entities may request a person's social security

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number when necessary to collect or disperse social security funds and when federal law requires the Federal Government to obtain a person's social security number from the business. Employers are permitted to request an employee's social security number without the above limitations.

The Attorney General is given the power to enforce the prohibition including the authority to negotiate an assurance that the violator will discontinue the practice, issue a cease and desist order and bring a civil action against anyone who knowingly violates a written assurance of discontinuance.

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
