	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the
2	Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

б	Whereas, legislative employees have not had a cost-of-living increase for several years; and
8	Whereas, during that time period, they have been subject to delayed paydays, delayed merit increases, shut-down days and
10	39-hour workweeks; and
12	Whereas, many legislative employees who were working during some or all of this period of lessened compensation have retired;

16	Whereas, it would appear only fair that they share in any initiative to compensate employees for this lessened
18	compensation; and
20	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
22	Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
24	safety; now, therefore, be it
26	Sec. 1. Lump-sum payment due. Resolved: That a retired employee of the Maine State Legislature who was employed for more
28	than one year during the period from the last cost-of-living increase given to state employees until December 31, 1996 must be
30	paid any lump-sum payment payable to those currently employed that is designed as compensation for the loss of the
32	cost-of-living increase.
34	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

38	SUMMARY
40	This resolve requires that retired legislative employees who served during the recent period when there were no cost-of-living
42	increases must receive any lump-sum payment due active employees as compensation for the lack of a cost-of-living increase.
