COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 938, L.D. 1285, Bill, "An Act to Define the Permissible Duties of Part-time and Full-time Law Enforcement Officers"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 2-A in the last 24 line (page 1, line 16 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: 26 "2001" the following: 'or when the funding for the operation of 26 the Judicial Department's computer system lapses, whichever 27 occurs first'

Further amend the bill in section 2 in subsection 1 by 30 striking out all of the last blocked paragraph (page 1, lines 49 and 50 and page 2, lines 1 to 4 in L.D.) and inserting in its 32 place the following:

 'No later than January 1, 1998, the board shall adopt rules identifying the permissible duties of part-time law enforcement
officers who have completed the training courses described in section 2804-B. The rules adopted are major substantive rules
for the purposes of Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A and must be implemented by December 31, 1998;'

Further amend the bill in section 3 in subsection 1 in the last 3 lines (page 2, lines 13 to 15 in L.D.) by striking out the following: 'and unless that person serves under the direct supervision of an officer who has completed and maintains the training required by section 2804-C'

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Further amend the bill in section 3 in subsection 3 in the last 2 lines (page 2, lines 21 and 22 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "additional certification as required by this

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chapter and 12 hours of recertification training each year" and 2 inserting in its place the following: 'additional-certification as-required-by-this-ehapter annual recertification training as prescribed by the board' 4 Further amend the bill in section 4 in subsection 1 in the 6 8th and 9th lines (page 2, lines 34 and 35 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "30 hours of recertification training each 8 in <u>year</u>" and inserting its place the following: 'the recertification requirements prescribed by the board' 10 Further amend the bill striking out all of sections 5 and 6 12 and inserting in their place the following: 14 'Sec. 5. 25 MRSA §2804-E, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1993, c. 16 744,  $\S7$ , is further amended to read: 1. Required. As a condition to the continued employment of 1.8 a person as a law enforcement officer with the power to make 2.0 arrests or the authority to carry a firearm in the course of duty by a municipality, county, the State or other nonfederal 22 employer, that person must successfully complete a-minimum-number of-hours of in-service recertification training as prescribed by 24 the board. 26 Sec. 6. 25 MRSA §2806, sub-§1, ¶A, as amended by PL 1989, c. 521,  $\S$ 9 and 17, is repealed and the following enacted in its 28 place: A. 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duties of those officers no later than March 1, 1998. The rules must be implemented no later than December 31, 1998.

This amendment further amends the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 25, section 2804-B to require a person covered by that section annually to complete specified recertification training. An officer who has completed the basic course described in Title 25, section 2804-C must complete board-specified recertification training each year.

This amendment also requires the board to review the certification of all law enforcement and corrections officers on March 1st of every year, beginning in 1999. The board must decertify those individuals who, upon review, do not meet certification or recertification requirements.

The amendment specifies that the provision regarding the additional percentage of the Government Operations Surcharge Fund to be paid to the Maine Criminal Justice Academy takes effect January 1, 2001, or when the funding for the operation of the Judicial Department's computer system lapses, whichever occurs first.

The amendment adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the bill.

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
