Resolve, to Form a Task Force to Examine Methods of Reimbursing Automobile Owners for Emissions Testing and Consequent Repair Costs.

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after 2 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and Whereas, thousands of motor vehicle owners in this State paid test fees and incurred repair costs under the auto emissions 6 testing program, which was required by state law in 7 counties during July and August of 1994; and 8 Whereas, 10 the testing mandate was suspended and then repealed effective April 28, 1995; and 12 Whereas, vehicle owners who complied with the testing mandate have borne an inequitable burden by paying costs not 14 imposed upon others in the State; and 16 Whereas, certain vehicle owners may once again be asked to incur costs if the State is required by federal mandate to test 18 motor vehicle emissions; and 20 Whereas, it is appropriate to search for ways to reimburse persons who bore an inequitable burden of costs for the previous 22 program and to search for possible ways to alleviate the costs of any possible future testing program; and 24 26 Whereas, it is appropriate to resolve these issues in a timely fashion; and 28 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 30 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 32 safety; now, therefore, be it 34 Sec. 1. Creation and charge. Resolved: That the Task Force to 36 Provide for Reimbursement of Auto Emissions Testing Costs, referred to in this resolve as the "task force," is established. The task force is charged to examine methods of reimbursing 38 vehicle owners for expenses incurred under the repealed auto emissions testing program and methods of alleviating costs for 40 any possible future testing program; and be it further 42 Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the task force consists

1. Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate;

by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; A representative of the Department of the Secretary of State, Bureau of Motor Vehicles, appointed by the Secretary of 6 State; A representative of the Department of Environmental 8 Protection, Bureau of Air Quality Control, appointed by the Commissioner of Environmental Protection; 10 A representative of the Maine Municipal Association, 12 appointed by the President of the Maine Municipal Association; 14 An auto technician who is certified by the National Excellence, that is, Institute for Automotive Service 16 "ASE-certified" technician, appointed by the Governor; and 18 7. One member of the public, appointed by the Governor. 20 All appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing 22 authorities shall notify the Executive Director of Legislative Council upon making their appointments; and be it 24 further 26 Resolved: Sec. 3. Convening. That the Chair Legislative Council shall call the task force together for its 28 first meeting no later than 30 days after the final appointment has been made; and be it further 30 Sec. 4. Chair. Resolved: That the members shall elect a chair 32 from among the membership at the first meeting of the task force; and be it further 34 Sec. 5. Study subject. Resolved: That the task force shall 36 explore methods of achieving the following: 38 Reimbursing motor vehicle owners who paid one or more test fees to CarTest for auto emissions testing; 40 42 Reimbursing motor vehicle owners who paid for repairs to their vehicles required as a result of failing an auto emissions test pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, former 44 chapter 28; and 46 Alleviating the impact of expenses that may be imposed upon motor vehicle owners as a result of any emissions testing 48 program that may be imposed upon the State or any portion of the State as a result of federal law. 50

Two members of the House of Representatives, appointed

The task force may hold 4 meetings to accomplish its objectives. In exploring methods of funding emissions testing costs and reimbursing costs paid for previous testing programs, the task force shall consider all feasible funding mechanisms including mechanisms such as allowing credits or deductions on individual income taxes or vouchers that may be used to pay state taxes on motor vehicles or the state portion of motor vehicle registration or driver license registrations. The task force shall also explore whether funding is available from the environmental justice program within the United Environmental Protection Agency regarding the effect on elderly and low-income persons. Any method of funding recommended by the task force may not result in shifting of costs to municipalities; and be it further

- Sec. 6. Staffing; assistance. Resolved: That, at the task force's request, the Legislative Council shall provide staffing assistance. The Department of Environmental Protection and the Department of the Secretary of State shall provide information and other assistance as requested by the task force; and be it further
- Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the task force are entitled to legislative per diem and expenses. Other members who are not state employees are entitled to reimbursement of expenses; and be it further

- Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than August 31, 1997, the task force shall submit a written report together with any recommended legislation to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resource matters with a copy to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council. The task force is authorized to submit legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature; and be it further
- Sec. 9. Funding. Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall fund the expenses of the task force within existing resources.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

This resolve creates a task force to examine methods of reimbursing persons for test fees and repair costs incurred as a result of the auto emissions testing program required by state

law in 1994 and repealed in 1995. The task force is also charged to examine ways to alleviate costs that may be imposed upon motor vehicle owners under any testing program imposed in the future under requirements of federal law.
