An Act to Amend the Hunting Laws As They Pertain to Proof of Prior Hunting License in Order to Be Exempt from Taking a Hunter Safety Course.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7071, sub-§7, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 270, \S 3 and 4, is amended to read:

Hunter safety course. 6 7. Any person who applies for a Maine license to hunt with firearms, other than a juvenile license, shall submit proof of having successfully completed a 8 hunter safety course as provided in section 7035, an equivalent 10 hunter safety course or satisfactory evidence of having previously held an adult license to hunt with firearms in this 12 State or any other state, province or country in--any--year beginning-with-1976.

When proof of competency eannet <u>can not</u> otherwise be provided, the person may substitute a signed affidavit that he <u>the person</u> has previously held the required adult hunting license or that-he has successfully completed the required hunter safety course.

SUMMARY

This bill recognizes a prior hunting license, regardless of 24 the year issued, as proof of competency in obtaining a Maine license.
