4	requirements for activities regulated pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, chapter 3, subchapter I, Article
6	5-A. In its evaluation, the State Planning Office shall consider the following issues:

10	1. Whether all of the activities that have been designated eligible for permit by rule are appropriate for the permit-by-rule process in light of the requirement to protect the
12	natural resources in, on or adjacent to which the activities are located;
14	2. Whether there are adequate checks to ensure compliance
