Resolve, to Establish the Council on Environmental Monitoring and Assessment.

Reference to the Committee on Natural Resources suggested and ordered printed.

Sec. 1. Council established. Resolved: That the Council on Environmental Monitoring and Assessment, referred to in this 2 resolve as the "council," is established; and be it further 4 Sec. 2. Council membership. **Resolved:** That the council 6 consists of the following members: The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife or the 8 1. commissioner's designee; 10 2. The Commissioner of Marine the Resources or commissioner's designee; 12 The Commissioner of Environmental Protection or the 3. 14 commissioner's designee; 16 The Commissioner of Conservation or the commissioner's 4. 18 designee; 20 5. The Director of the State Planning Office or the director's designee; and 22 One representative of the University of Maine System 6. appointed by the Chancellor of the University of Maine System; 24 and be it further 26 Sec. 3. Appointments; meetings. **Resolved:** That all 28 appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by all appointing 30 authorities once the selections have been made. Within 15 days after completion of the appointment of all members, the Chair of 32 the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the council. The council shall select a chair from among its 34 members; and be it further 36 Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the council shall devise a mechanism to provide ongoing coordination and communication among 38 existing volunteer water quality monitoring programs and examine ways to promote the use of environmental data collected by the 40 volunteers; and be it further 42 Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the council may request staffing assistance from the Legislative Council; and be it 44 further 46 Sec. 6. Report. Resolved: That the council shall submit its 48 report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature no later than January 15, 1998. If the council requires an extension it 50

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may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.

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## **SUMMARY**

This resolve establishes the Council on Environmental 8 Monitoring and Assessment. The council is directed to devise a mechanism to provide ongoing coordination and communication among 10 existing volunteer water quality monitoring programs and to examine ways to promote the use of environmental data collected 12 by the volunteers.
