Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §480-E, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

7. Maintenance dredging. Notwithstanding section 344, subsection 7, an individual permit issued by the department 6 pursuant to this article is required for maintenance dredging 8 performed in, on or over high quality waters of the State that constitute an outstanding national resource if the amount of 10 material to be dredged exceeds 50,000 cubic yards. For purposes of this subsection, "high quality waters of the State that constitute an outstanding national resource" means those water 12 bodies in national and state parks and wildlife refuges; those water bodies in public reserved lands; and those water bodies 14 classified as Class AA or SA pursuant to section 465, subsection 1 or section 465-B, subsection 1 and listed under section 467, 16 468 or 469.

SUMMARY

22 This bill specifies that maintenance dredging may not be performed without an individual permit issued by the Department of Environmental Protection when the activity is located in, on 24 or over high quality waters of the State that constitute an outstanding national resource if the amount of material to be 26 dredged exceeds 50,000 cubic yards. A permit by rule does not satisfy the permit requirement under the Maine Revised Statutes, 28 Title 38, chapter 3, subchapter I, Article 5-A for this activity. The bill also provides a definition of "high quality 30 waters of the State that constitute an outstanding national resource" that is consistent with the classification system for 32 surface waters in the State.
