COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 416, L.D. 1337, Bill, "An Act to Amend the Laws Relating to Education"

Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 3, 20 and 21.

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 21 the following:

Sec. 22. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from Other Special Revenue funds to carry out the purposes of this Act.

22 The Board of Barbering and Cosmetology within the Department
24 of Professional and Financial Regulation will require additional
Other Special Revenue allocations of \$7,000 and \$6,000 in fiscal
26 years 1997-98 and 1998-99, respectively, for costs associated
with the licensing of schools of barbering and cosmetology.

28 The licensure of schools of barbering and cosmetology will
30 increase application and licensing fee collections. The
32 estimated increases of dedicated revenue to the Board of
Barbering and Cosmetology are \$7,200 and \$6,000 in fiscal years
1997-98 and 1998-99, respectively.

34 The elimination of the teacher candidate employment registry
36 within the Department of Education and the transfer of authority
to license barbering and cosmetology schools to the Department of
38 Professional and Financial Regulation will result in
insignificant decreases in General Fund revenue from registration
and licensing fees.'

42 SUMMARY

44 This amendment strikes section 3 from the bill and leaves
46 the statutory provision allowing voters of a member municipality
to petition for withdrawal from a school administrative district
48 with a simple majority vote in place. This amendment also
strikes sections 20 and 21 from the bill since these provisions
refer to actions already approved in Public Law 1997, chapter
50 24. Finally, this amendment adds an allocation section and a
fiscal note.
