Resolve, Establishing a Blue Ribbon Commission to Study the Effect of Government Regulation on Small Businesses in Maine.

(EMERGENCY)

Reference to the Committee on Business and Economic Development suggested and ordered printed.

Presented by Senator MacKINNON of York. Cosponsored by Senators: JENKINS of Androscoggin, LIBBY of York, Representative: VIGUE of Winslow. Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, this resolve establishes the Blue Ribbon Commission to Study the Effect of Government Regulation on Small Businesses; and

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Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and the report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

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Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Blue Ribbon Commission to Study the Effect of Government Regulation on Small Businesses, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further

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Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 12 members appointed as follows: The Governor shall appoint 6 members, to include at least 2 members from the Governor's cabinet, one member representing the business sector, one member representing employee unions and one state employee; the Speaker of the House shall appoint 3 members, to include at least one Representative and one member representing the public sector; and the President of the Senate shall appoint 3 members, to include at least one Senator and one member representing the private sector; and be it further

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Sec. 3. Appointments; meetings. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of The commission shall select a chair from among its members; and be it further

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- Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study the effect of government regulation on small businesses throughout the State; and be it further
- Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission may request staffing assistance from the Legislative Council; and be it further

2	Sec. 6. Expenses. Resolved: That the members of the
	commission may not receive any compensation or reimbursement for
4	expenses; and be it further
6	Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That no later than December 15,
	1997, the commission shall submit its report, together with any
8	necessary implementing legislation, to the Joint Standing
	Committee on Business and Economic Development and the Executive
10	Director of the Legislative Council. The Joint Standing
	Committee on Business and Economic Development is authorized to
12	report out any legislation during the Second Regular Session of
	the 118th Legislature concerning the findings and recommendations
14	of the commission.
16	If the commission requires and extension, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.
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20	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.
