The amount of funds appropriated from 16 the General Fund for prevention to the Office of Substance Abuse, as established in Title 5, chapter 521, may not be less than the dollar amount collected or received by the bureau and the 18 commission under this section. 20 6. Use of funds. At least 80% of the funds appropriated to 2.2 the Office of Substance Abuse pursuant to this section must be used to fund eligible education and prevention activities in elementary and secondary schools that receive at least 60% of 24 their funding from public sources. Eligible activities include 26 development of curriculum materials, staff and student training and safe and drug-free after-school activities.
