Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §721, as amended by PL 1989, c. 104, Pt. C, §§8 and 10, is further amended to read:

§721. Purpose

The purpose of this article is to establish in Androscoggin County a method of appropriating money for county expenditures, including the salaries for county officers, according to a budget which that must first be adopted by a budget committee and must then be approved - by - the - Legislature submitted to the county This article amends the statutory method in commissioners. sections 2, 701 and 702 by creating a committee elected by Androscoggin County municipal officers with authority to adopt or amend the budget subject to review and revision by the county commissioners and, if revised, subject to subsequent acceptance or rejection by the budget committee as provided in this The-Legislature-continues-to-have-authority-to-approve article. but--not--to--amend--the--budget-This article applies only to Androscoggin County.

- Duties. The county budget committee shall review the budget and estimates, including the salaries for county officers,
 prepared by the county commissioners, and shall approve a final county budget as provided in this article.

- 34 5. Adoption of budget. After the public hearing hearings held under subsection 4 are completed, the budget committee may-further-increase,-decrease,-alter-and-revise-the 36 proposed -- itemized -- budgets -- subject -- to -- the -- conditions -- and restrictions-imposed-in-subsection-3 shall adopt a final budget 38 and transmit that budget to the county commissioners. The county 40 commissioners may not revise the budget adopted by the budget committee, except by unanimous vote of the commissioners elected. If the adopted budget is changed by the county 42 commissioners, the budget committee may reject that change by a 2/3 vote of its membership. Those actions are final and are not 44 subject to further action by either county commissioners or the budget committee. The prepesed-itemized budget and the capital 46 improvement program submitted under subsection 1 must be finally adopted by a majority vote of the budget committee at a duly 48 called meeting held before the end of the county's fiscal year.

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SUMMARY

12 This bill amends the budget approval process Androscoggin County by removing the requirement that the budget 14be submitted to the Legislature for final approval. Instead, the existing budget committee is empowered to adopt the budget which 16 submit to the county commissioners. commissioners may alter the budget committee's budget only by a 18 unanimous vote; and, if the commissioners do so, the budget committee may reject the county commissioners' change by a 2/3 20 vote.
