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## 6 §19203-G. Bona fide occupational exposure of emergency services worker

An emergency services worker who experiences a bona fide 10 occupational exposure may require the person whose blood or body fluid is the source of the exposure to submit to an HIV test and 12 may further require that the results of that test be disclosed to that emergency services worker.

## SUMMARY

18 This bill provides that an emergency services worker who is exposed to potentially infectious blood or other bodily fluids of 20 another person in the course of employment may require that person to submit to an HIV test and may require that the results 22 of that test be disclosed to that emergency services worker.
