This amendment changes the bill in the following ways:

1. It amends the title to reflect more accurately the intent of the statutory provision;

It allows a person who will be at least 5 years of age by November 15th of the school year to enroll in kindergarten after determination by the school administrative unit that the person is ready for kindergarten if a parent or guardian of a person makes a written request to the school administrative unit;

3. It clarifies that the initial assessment of the child's readiness for kindergarten must be made through the use of the school's current screening mechanism and that this assessment is final; and
