Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following: 24

Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the 28 enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place 30 the following:

It clarifies that the current requirements applicable to minor access to health care 22 apply to prescription contraceptive supplies. It separates those supplies from the general rules applicable to family planning 24 services. It takes effect October 1, 1997. 26 This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
