This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services. It deletes the portion of the bill that addressed the qualifications of the acting superintendent of the state mental health institutes. It adds a provision limiting the time a person may serve as acting superintendent to 6 months, with no reappointment possible, the same limitations applicable to acting deputy commissioners of executive branch departments. It also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
