Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

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This bill requires the Bureau of Parks and Lands within the Department of Conservation to establish a policy wherein the prudent use of ATV's is allowed on public lands not designated as primitive-use lands.
