Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7857, sub-§5-A is enacted to read:

5-A. Operating an ATV on a controlled access highway or public way after license suspension. A person is guilty of operating an ATV on a public way after license suspension if the person operates an ATV on a controlled access highway or within the right-of-way limits of a controlled access highway or on any portion of a public way maintained or utilized for the operation of conventional motor vehicles or upon the sidewalks of any public way after that person's license to operate a motor vehicle has been suspended by the Secretary of State or a court of this State.

This bill prohibits a person whose license to operate a motor vehicle has been suspended by the Secretary of State or a court from operating an ATV on a controlled access highway or public way. A person who violates this prohibition is guilty of a Class E crime.
