An Act to Prohibit Dedimus Justices from Receiving Payment for Services other than Long-distance Travel Reimbursement.

Be it enacted by the reopie of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §4-A is enacted to read:
§4-A. Dedimus justice; payment
A dedimus justice may not ask for or receive payment for services except reimbursement for travel expenses if:
1. Required travel. The travel is required to perform the service; and
2. Total distance. The total distance for travel one way is 50 miles or greater.
Travel may be reimbursed at a rate no greater than that allowed by section 8 for state officials not subject to any
bargaining agreements.
SUMMARY
Dedimus justices, persons appointed to swear in public officials, are not prohibited from charging for their services.
Currently, some dedimus justices charge a fee and others do not. This bill prohibits them from charging any fees other than
reimbursement for long-distance, 50 miles or over, travel
