Resolve, to Establish a Committee to Review the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act.

Sec. 1. Committee established. Resolved: That the Committee to Review the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1986, referred to in this resolve as the "committee," is established for the purpose of reviewing the federal Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1986, 15 United States Code, Sections 2641 et seq. as it relates to asbestos abatement in Maine schools; and be it further

Sec. 2. Committee membership. Resolved: That the committee consists of 6 members with expertise in the use, removal or study of chemicals and asbestos. Of the 6 members, 2 are appointed by the Governor, 2 are appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and 2 are appointed by the President of the Senate; and be it further

Appointments; meetings. **Resolved:** Sec. 3. That 16 all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the 18 Legislative Council must be notified all by appointing 20 authorities once the selections have been made. Within 15 days after the appointment of all members, the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of 22 the committee. The committee shall select a chair from among its 24 members; and be it further

26 Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the committee shall review the federal Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1986 to 28 determine the appropriateness of the State's current response to asbestos abatement in schools throughout Maine. In conducting 30 the review the committee may include, but not be limited to, an examination of the following professional literature:

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Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the committee shall request staffing assistance from the Legislative Council; and be it further

Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: That all members of the nòt state employees committee who are are entitled to б reimbursement for expenses as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12002, upon application to the 8 Executive Director of the Legislative Council for those expenses; and be it further 10

12 Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the committee shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to 14 the First Regular Session of the 119th Legislature by February 1, 1999. If the committee requires an extension, it may apply to 16 the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.

SUMMARY

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This resolve establishes the Committee to Review the 22 Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1986 for the purpose of reviewing the federal act as it relates to asbestos abatement in 24 schools throughout this State.

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
