L8	This bill may result in significant increases in costs for various public works projects contracted out by the State. The amount of the additional costs, which can not be estimated, will
20	depend on the size and number of public works projects in any given year as well as the benefit rates paid by prospective
22	contractors.
24	The Department of Labor will require an additional General Fund appropriation of \$38,140 in fiscal year 1998-99 for the
26	costs of administering the prevailing wage law. The estimated General Fund appropriations required to fund the full year costs
28	will be approximately \$37,000 annually beginning in fiscal year 1999-2000.
30	The additional workload and administrative costs associated
32	with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial
34	Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'
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38 SUMMARY

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This amendment eliminates the requirement that the Office of the Attorney General investigate violations of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, chapter 15. Under current law, the Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Standards is responsible for investigations and the Office of the Attorney General is responsible for bringing enforcement actions.

This amendment also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the bill.
