18	SUMMARY
10	This bill is one of 5 bills designed to enhance enforcement
20	of fish and game laws, marine resources laws and motor vehicle laws by making enforcement easier and reducing the number of
22	contested cases. Several crimes are redefined as civil violations to allow efficient processing by the courts.
24	Violators have the right to contest the matter in court.
26	This bill revises the responsibilities of game wardens by
28	allowing them to take cash or credit card payments for bail in any location when an arrest is made. Game wardens making arrests
30	in Cumberland County may take the defendant to any District Court serving Cumberland County, rather than being limited to the
