	Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §1176 is enacted to read:
<u>§11</u>	76. Recovery of damages and attorney's fees
аı	1. Generally. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, victim of a crime, misdemeanor, negligence or omission of duty
in def	doing or forbearing by another may file a claim against the endant or the defendant's estate, heirs or assigns to recover
	ages. The victim may recover compensatory damages, punitive ages and attorney's fees.
	2. Minors. If the defendant is a minor, the victim may
mak	e a claim against the minor's parents or guardians.
	3. Claims less than \$3,000. If the claim is for damages
	aling less than \$3,000, the victim may recover in small claims rt.
	4. Installment payments. If the defendant is unable to pay amount awarded to the victim, the defendant may make weekly tallment payments until the award is paid in full. Each
	ment must be at least 10% of the defendant's weekly income.
wit	5. Failure to pay. If the defendant fails to pay the award hin 30 days of the court's order or fails to make 2
cor	secutive installment payments, the victim may attach the endant's real or personal property in accordance with Title
14,	chapter 507.
	SUMMARY
	This bill authorizes victims of a crime, negligence or
	ssion of duty to make a claim against the defendant to recover
the	ppensatory damages, punitive damages and attorney's fees. If e defendant is a minor, a claim may be made against the
fil	endant's parents or guardians. Claims less than \$3,000 may be ed in small claims court. The defendant may make installment ments and the victim may attach the defendant's property if

the defendant fails to pay.
