Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 24 MRSA §2329, sub-§1, as repealed and replaced by PL 1983, c. 527, §1, is amended to read: 4

6 1. Purpose. The Legislature recognizes that alcoholism and drug dependency constitute major health problems in the State and in the Nation. The Legislature further recognizes that alcoholism 8 is a disease and that alcoholism and drug dependency can be 10 effectively treated. As such, alcoholism and drug dependency warrant the same attention from the health care industry as other serious diseases and illnesses. The Legislature further 12 recognizes that health care contracts and managed care plans, at times, fail to provide adequate benefits for the treatment of 14alcoholism and drug dependency, which results in more costly health care for treatment of complications caused by the lack of 16 early intervention and other treatment services for persons suffering from these--illnesses the diseases of alcoholism and 18drug addiction. This situation causes a higher health care, 20 social, law enforcement and economic cost to the citizens of this State than is necessary, including the need for the State to 22 provide treatment to some subscribers at public expense. То assist the many citizens of this State who suffer from these illnesses diseases in a more cost effective way, the Legislature 24 declares that certain health care coverage providing benefits for 26 the treatment of the illness diseases of alcoholism and drug dependency shall must be included in all group health care contracts and managed care plans. 28

C. "Treatment plan" means a written plan initiated at the time of admission, approved by a doctor of medicine, doctor of osteopathy or a state-licensed alcohol and drug counselor employed by a certified or licensed substance abuse program, including, but not limited to, the patient's medical, drug and alcoholism history; record of physical examination; diagnosis; assessment of physical capabilities; mental capacity; orders for medication, diet and special needs for the patient's health or safety and treatment, including medical, psychiatric, psychological, social services, individual, family and group counseling; and educational, support and referral services.

A health maintenance organization that issues group 28 or individual health care contracts may not exclude state-licensed alcohol and drug counselors from reimbursement by 30 requiring such counselors to possess education or credentials other than those required by the State for licensure as long as 32 the counselor provides services in or through a facility certified or licensed by the State.

- 4. Services; providers. Each group or individual contract 36 shall provide, at a minimum, for the following coverage, pursuant to a treatment plan:
 - A. Residential treatment at a hospital or free-standing residential treatment center that is licensed, certified or approved by the State; and
- B. Outpatient care rendered by a state-licensed alcohol and drug counselor or other professional under the direct supervision of a state-licensed alcohol and drug counselor.
- 48 Treatment or confinement at any facility does not preclude 48 further or additional treatment at any other eligible facility, provided that the benefit days used do not exceed the total 50 number of benefit days provided for under the contract.

5. Exceptions. This section does not apply to health 2 maintenance organization plans issued to employers with 20 or fewer employees insured under the group policy or to group 4 policies designed primarily to supplement the Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Uniformed Services, as described in the б United States Code, Title 10, Section 1072, subsection 4. 8 6. Limits; coinsurance; deductibles. Any policy or contract that provides coverage for the services required by this section 10 may contain provisions for maximum benefits and coinsurance, and reasonable limitations, deductibles and exclusions to the extent 12 that these provisions are not inconsistent with the requirements of this section. 1416 7. Notice. At the time of delivery or renewal, the health maintenance organization shall provide written notification to all individuals eligible for benefits under group policies or 18contracts of these alcoholism and drug dependency benefits. 20 8. For purposes of this 28 section, all contracts are deemed to be renewed no later than the next yearly anniversary of the contract date. 30 SUMMARY 32 34 This bill makes the following changes to the laws governing health insurance coverage for alcohol and drug dependency 36 treatment. 38 1. Current law requires that nonprofit hospital or medical service organizations and group health insurers provide benefits for the treatment of alcohol and drug dependency. This bill 40 requires that health maintenance organizations offer the same benefits. 42 2. The bill specifies that any managed care plan issued by 44 a nonprofit hospital or medical service organization or group health insurer must provide benefits for the treatment of 46 alcoholism and drug dependency. 48 This bill specifies that benefits for alcoholism or drug 3. dependency services must be provided by a state-licensed alcohol 50

and drug counselor or other professional under the direct supervision of such a counselor.

The bill prohibits insurers, health maintenance organizations and nonprofit hospital or medical service organizations from excluding state-licensed alcohol and drug counselors from reimbursement by requiring such counselors to б possess education or credentials other than those required by the 8 State for licensure.
